REVISED EDITION OF CANNON'S PROCEDURE IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Mr. BURLESON. Mr. Speaker, by direction of the Committee on House Administration, I offer a privileged resolution (H. J. Res. 385) and ask for its immediate consideration.

The Clerk read as follows:

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That there shall be printed and bound for the use of the House 1,500 copies of Cannon's Procedure in the House of Representatives, by Clarence Cannon, to be printed under the supervision of the author and to be distributed to Members by the Speaker.

SEC. 2. That, notwithstanding any provision of the copyright laws and regulations with respect to publications in the public domain, Cannon's Procedure in the House of Representatives shall be subject to copyright by the author thereof.

Mr. HOEVEN. Mr. Speaker, reserving the right to object, I understand this matter comes from the Committee on House Administration by unanimous vote.

Mr. BURLESON. That is correct.

Mr. HOEVEN. Mr. Speaker, I withdraw my reservation of objection.
