EXTENDING DESIGN PATENT OF IN-  
SIGNIA OF MASSACHUSETTS DE-  
PARTMENT OF THE UNITED  
AMERICAN VETERANS OF THE  
UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, INC.

The Clerk called the bill (H.R. 7888) providing for the extension of patent numbered D-119,187.

There being no objection, the Clerk read the bill, as follows:

H.R. 7888

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That (a) a certain design patent issued by the United States Patent Office of date February 27, 1940, being patent numbered D-119,187, which is the insignia of the Massachusetts Department of the United States of America, Incorporated, is hereby renewed and extended for an additional period of 14 years from and after the date of enactment of this act, with all the rights and privileges pertaining to the same, being generally known as the insignia of the Massachusetts Department of the United American Veterans of the United States of America, Incorporated; (b) no person who has manufactured the design of such patent between February 27, 1954, and the date of the enactment of this act shall be held liable for infringement of such patent by reason of the continued manufacture and sale thereof.*

With the following committee amendment:

On page 1, line 6, after "United" insert "American Veterans of the United".

The committee amendment was agreed to.

The bill was ordered to be engrossed and read a third time, was read the third time, and passed, and a motion to reconsider was laid on the table.
