# A BILL

To amend subsections (b), (c), and (d) of section 294 of title 28, United States Code, relating to the assignment of retired judges to active duty.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-1 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,  $\mathbf{2}$ That subsections (b), (c), and (d) of section 294 of 3 title 28, United States Code, be amended to read as follows: 4 "(b) Any judge of the United States who has retired  $\mathbf{5}$ from regular active service under section 371 (b) or 372 6 (a) of this title shall be known and designated as a senior  $\mathbf{7}$ judge and may continue to perform such judicial duties as 8 he is willing and able to undertake, when designated and 9 assigned as provided in subsections (c) and (d). 10

1 "(c) Any retired circuit or district judge may be desig-2 nated and assigned by the chief judge or judicial council of 3 his circuit to perform such judicial duties within the circuit 4 as he is willing and able to undertake. Any other retired 5 judge of the United States may be designated and assigned 6 by the chief judge of his court to perform such judicial duties 7 in such court as he is willing and able to undertake.

The Chief Justice of the United States shall "(d) 8 maintain a roster of retired judges of the United States who 9 are willing and able to undertake special judicial duties 10from time to time outside their own circuit, in the case of 11 12a retired circuit or district judge, or in a court other than 13 their own, in the case of other retired judges, which roster 14 shall be known as the roster of senior judges. Any such 15retired judge of the United States may be designated and as-16signed by the Chief Justice to perform such judicial duties as 17he is willing and able to undertake in a court outside his 18 own circuit, in the case of a retired circuit or district judge, 19 or in a court other than his own, in the case of any other 20retired judge of the United States. Such designation and 21assignment to a court of appeals or district court shall be 22made upon the presentation of a certificate of necessity by 23the chief judge or circuit justice of the circuit wherein the

shall be made to the Supreme Court."
