Mr. MATHIAS (for himself and Mr. THURMOND) (by request) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

## A BILL

To authorize appropriations for the Patent and Trademark Office in the Department of Commerce.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That there are authorized to be appropriated for the payment
- 4 of salaries and necessary expenses of the Patent and Trade-
- 5 mark Office to become available for fiscal year 1986,
- 6 \$84,739,000, and in fiscal years 1987 and 1988 such sums
- 7 as may be necessary as well as such additional or supplemen-
- 8 tal amounts as may be necessary, for increases in salary, pay,
- 9 retirement, or other employee benefits authorized by law.
- 10 Funds available under this Act shall be used to reduce by 50

per centum the payment of fees under section 41 (a) and (b) of title 35, United States Code, by independent inventors and nonprofit organizations as defined in regulations established by the Commissioner of Patents and Trademarks, and by small business concerns as defined in section 3 of the Small Business Act and any subsequent legislation amending that section or transferring responsibilities under that section and by regulations established by the Small Business Administration or its successor. When so specified and to the extent provided in an appropriation Act, any amount appropriated 11 pursuant to this Act and, in addition, such fees as shall be 12 collected pursuant to title 35, United States Code, and the Trademark Act of 1946, as amended (15 U.S.C. 1051 et 13 14 seq.), may remain available without fiscal year limitation.
