SDC Tier 2 Distribution

The Tier 2 distribution is for commercial use within industrial firms. The license granted is non-exclusive and for internal use only. The license does not cover the right to use the program or portions of the program in any service or product offered by the licensee. Programs are generally provided for a paid-up royalty or an annual royalty fee.

Tier 3 Distribution By Commercial Firms

The Tier 3 distribution is performed by private software companies which are granted a license from Stanford to develop the software and then to sublicense it to others. The commercial distributor is able to provide the installation, maintenance, debugging, enhancements, training and support that the SDC cannot. In some cases, recipients of Tier 1 or Tier 2 distribution from the SDC may also become customers of the Tier 3 distributors, desiring the more developed version and other services provided.

Not all software programs are available from a Tier 3 distributor. Some are currently distributed only from the SDC. When a Tier 3 licensee is sought, Stanford's Office of Technology Licensing considers such factors as:

- market access of the prospective licensee to potential user-customers
- technological competence of the prospective licensee with respect to the particular software program
- resources that are available to the prospective licensee for development, marketing and support

Purpose

To disseminate Stanford-developed computer software efficiently and broadly.

Background

The number of research projects involving computer software is steadily increasing. Mere publication in a research journal without access to the computer software itself is often inadequate to transfer research methodologies and findings to those wishing to use or build upon Stanford research.

Stanford has developed a three-tiered approach to this problem. Many software programs are available directly from Stanford to the non-profit (Tier 1) or commercial (Tier 2) user through the Software Distribution Center. In some cases, Stanford may grant a full commercial license (Tier 3) to a company which will enhance, market, and support the program. A given program may be available on multiple tiers.

The Software Distribution Center (SDC) is a mechanism to distribute computer software efficiently to the largest number of potential users. The SDC provides a focal point for individuals at other universities, in industry, in government and elsewhere who wish to access the wide variety of Stanford software.

The SDC provides no product support or warranties. The software is distributed on an "as is, with all defects" basis.

SDC Tier 1 Distribution

The Tier 1 distribution is for academic research use. The license granted is nonexclusive and for internal use only. Programs are generally provided at the cost of distribution. This type of distribution is primarily made to academic colleagues, non-profit research institutions, and government agencies.
