

AMERICAN STATISTICS INDEX

The U.S. Government is a prolific publisher of statistics. Federal agencies produce a continual flow of facts and figures on virtually every aspect of American life in and matters of worldwide concern.

American Statistical Index (ASI) is considered to be a master guide and index to all U.S. Government statistical publications. It was created as a single source to locate data currently collected by the federal government on a particular subject.

Specifically, ASI performs the following functions:

1. Identify the statistical data published by the federal government;
2. Catalog the publications in which these data appear with full bibliographic information;
3. Announce new publications;
4. Describe the contents of these publications; and
5. Index this information in subject detail.

ASI Monthly Supplements: To assure prompt coverage, ASI publishes Monthly Supplements containing full abstracts and indexing for newly issued statistical publications. These include wholly new publications, new reports in continuing series, articles, or special features in periodicals, and updates or new editions of annuals, semiannuals, or other publications covered in previous ASI editions.

ASI Annual and Multiple Year Cumulations: The Monthly Supplements abstracts and indexes are cumulated and enhanced to produce separate Annual Abstracts and index volumes. They supplement ASI's base 1974 Annual and Retrospective Edition.

The Annual index volumes, in turn, are cumulated into multiple year indexes.

ASI includes all federal publications that contain primary data of research value or secondary data collected on a special subject, and also special studies and analyses or other statistics-related materials.

Today, six large federal statistical agencies, each in a specialized field, have as their major function the regular collection, analysis, and publication of such data. They are:

1. Bureau of the Census;
2. Bureau of Labor Statistics;
3. Crop Reporting Board, Department of Agriculture;
4. Energy Information Administration;
5. National Center for Health Statistics; and
6. National Center for Education Statistics.

BIOMEDICAL BUSINESS INTERNATIONAL

Biomedical Business International (BBI), published 24 times per year, is a perceptive analysis of the healthcare industry and marketplace, focusing on new technology. Each issue covers a variety of market, technology, and industry updates, business developments, and advances in the medical field. It contains considerable market data in dollars, shares, and competitors when discussing topics. The two semiannual indexes provides a convenient way to locate topics and market data from back issues. There is a separate listing of the companies referred to in BBI and a section containing the subjects covered. The 1986 subscription rate is \$545 (annual).

BBI offers an information service, MARKET DETAIL, for those who need rapid access to detailed market data and do not want to spend a lot of time or money conducting lengthy research or purchasing costly reports.

Packages are custom-designed to meet specific needs. Information is drawn from BBI's data base and includes material from market reports, surveys, seminar proceedings, company files, and other information.

Packages are available on a wide range of health care topics. Other topics can be covered upon request.

A typical MARKET DETAIL package includes:

Each report contains 20-40 pages and costs \$850 per topic. This information can be delivered in as little as 48 hours.

The Medical Search Service -- Current Listings: Contains 39 journals and periodicals, about 40 medical texts and reference books, 6 indexes and abstracts including MEDLINE, the on-line version of Index Medicus produced by the National Library of Medicine.

The Medical Search Service -- PDQ (Physicians Data Query): Newly developed by the National Cancer Institute, PDQ allows immediate access to three types of constantly updated information.

The NCI developed PDQ to aid physicians, whose primary focus is not cancer care, in keeping up-to-date with current cancer information:

1. PDQC (the cancer information file) contains prognostic and treatment information on all major cancers. Each tumor summary provides up-to-date information on prognosis, relevant staging, and a description of comparable treatment options which are considered to be "state-of-the-art";

CORPORATE TECHNOLOGY DIRECTORY (continued)

Each corporate profile includes:

1. Name, address, and phone;
2. Business description;
3. Private or public status;
4. Subs. div./or independent status;
5. Year of incorporation;
6. Names, titles, and departmental responsibilities of up to eight key executives;
7. Number of employees (by range);
8. Annual revenues (by range); and
9. Product information categorized.

Also, available as a data base.

The CorpTech data base offers users the data from the CorpTech Directory that runs on a PC using CorpTech's software. It supports searching on over 20 different criteria in any combination, mailing list and form letters production, statistical analysis and is updated quarterly.

These products were developed for those who monitor and track high-tech companies for the purpose of research and development, strategic planning, market, and/or competitive analysis and mergers/acquisitions.

DIALOG

The DIALOG Information Retrieval Service has been in operation since 1972. More than 250 data bases in a broad scope of disciplines are available on the system.

The data bases on the system contain over 120 million records.

DIALOG data bases offer subject coverage in science, business, technology, chemistry, law, medicine, engineering, social sciences, business, economics, current events, and more. In addition, they provide indexes to book reviews and biographies; directories of companies, persons, and associations; and access to the complete text of articles from newspapers, dozens of journals, and other original sources.

Data bases are regularly updated providing the most recent information. Many DIALOG data bases are exclusive ... not available on-line anywhere else.

The criteria applied in selecting a data base for inclusion is:

1. Available on-line for use in an interactive mode;
2. Available to the public or to organizations that can establish their eligibility through subscriptions, membership, or other stated qualifications; and
3. Accessible through an on-line service organization connected to one or more international telecommunications networks and/or to networks that serve one country or a limited set of countries.

The Directory is organized as follows:

1. Descriptions: This main section is arranged alphabetically by data base name. If a data base is not found in this section, it may be in the Master Index. The uniformly formatted entries are organized according to the fixed set of headings. They include name, type, subject and contents, and updating schedule;

2. Compact DISCLOSURE is a single compact disc that contains all information currently in the DISCLOSURE data base. For a flat annual fee, this includes cumulative quarterly updates. This disc makes PC into a powerful data base of public company information.
3. MicroDISCLOSURE is software linking a PC to DISCLOSURE On-Line. This "user friendly" gateway software opens up financial information for any of the public companies.
4. Electronic Company Filing Index is a data base index updated every 24 hours with lists of which companies have filed reports with the SEC. Access to the data base may be made through a PC.
5. MicroSCAN/DISCLOSURE each month provides selected financial information from the DISCLOSURE On-Line data base and sends it to you on diskettes. This eliminates on-line fees.
6. DISCLOSURE/Spectrum is an on-line data base of corporate ownership information for approximately 5,000 companies. This data base is also available through numerous on-line vendors.
7. DISCLOSURE Tape Leasing provides in-house access to information. With the magnetic tape, you load the most current DISCLOSURE data base information into your own mainframe computer, with periodic updating. There is a special leasing plan for universities.

DOCUMENT RETRIEVAL --- SOURCES AND SERVICES

Scope: This directory is international in scope ... listing suppliers in the U.S. and other countries.

The term DOCUMENT is used to describe any sort of nonbook publication, not strictly a government or legal document. Identified are sources of all types of documents: papers, journal articles, patents, legal documents, conference proceedings, and any published, nonbook materials.

The document retrieval field meets the burgeoning need for documents that can not be obtained by traditional sources such as interlibrary loan. Our information society demands more and more timely information. Each source strives to provide the library, business, industrial, and legal communities with access to documents delivered quickly with a minimum effort on the part of the requester.

ENCYCLOPEDIA OF ASSOCIATIONS (continued)

Companion volumes give access to other organizations:

1. Vol. 2: Geographic and Executive Indexes: The Geographic Index enables you to approach questions about association activities on a geographic basis. It lists in state and city order all the associations that are arranged in Vol. 1 by subject. Included are addresses, telephone numbers, names of executives, and Vol. 1 entry numbers.

The Executive Index lists all the executives mentioned in Vol. 1, followed by their titles, names of their organizations, complete addresses, and telephone numbers;

2. Vol. 3: New Associations and Projects: Entries describe newly formed and newly found associations not listed in Vol. 1. These new groups tend to be concerned with new problems not adequately covered elsewhere (Price \$210); and
3. Updating Service to Vol. 1: Reports approximately 10,000 major changes (association name, telephone number, address, executive officer, and mergers and other changes in status) between editions for some 4,000 major associations listed in Vol. 1 (Price \$175).

The federal government is the world's largest supplier of computerized data bases and data files. The government collects volumes of information on almost every subject imaginable. The Finder is designed to identify sources of information and shows how to get them. It identifies over 3,000 data bases and files and contains three sections:

1. Government Controlled Data Bases: Data bases searchable directly on-line or through federal agencies, their contractors, or designated centers;
2. Commercial Data Bases: Government supplied data and available to the public through commercial data base vendors; and

FEDERAL DATA BASE FINDER (continued)

2. Once you are certain of what you need, locate a government agency responsible for that subject. One probably exists. The nationwide offices of the Federal Information Center (FIC), listed in your telephone book under "U.S. Government," exist primarily to help track down appropriate government contacts, programs, agencies, resources, etc. If a FIC number is not listed in your telephone book, contact:

Two helpful directories for locating sources are: Information USA (by Matthew Lesko) and The United States Government Manual, published annually by the U.S. Government Printing Office. Both may be in your library;

3. Unless a government official is a computer specialist, they may "freeze" when you mention the words "computerized data base." To prevent this, tell the official you are looking for information on whatever it is you need. The employee will probably start to give suggestions ... then you can ask if a data base exists. Often the officials have obtained their working data from such a data base, but tend to think in terms of information, not computers;
4. Most government data bases, unless they are commercial vendors, can not be directly accessed by the public due to Privacy Act restrictions. Therefore, be sensitive to the government employee's hesitation about helping get access to the data base. When this happens, explain that you would like to know if the staff could do a search, as you realize there may be restricted material in the data base. This is important. Many federal officials automatically assume you want direct access, and they will deny your request, when in reality a compromise may be possible; and
5. Given the fact that government data contains restricted information, you may be told that a Freedom of Information (FOIA) request is necessary to secure data. Don't panic and drop your request. Simply ask to speak directly with the FOI officer. After explaining your request, they may tell you that an FOI letter is not really necessary. If this is the case, have the FOI officer clear the way to get the materials needed. Sometimes you are asked to submit such a request primarily because a staff person assumes you'll never bother to write the letter, and then be spared a search. Should an FOI letter actually be required, don't despair. The letter is easy to write. Chances are you'll get the information you need (although you will be charged for staff time).

FIND/SVP (continued)

More than 11,000 reports from over 500 U.S. and non-U.S. research publishers are included in the latest edition.

FINDEX is an annual service with a midyear supplement. It is produced from a computerized data base of market and industry reports and is continually updated. In addition, you can call the Update-by-Phone Service to inquire whether the data base contains reports more current than those found in print.

FROST & SULLIVAN

Frost & Sullivan, Inc., formed in 1961, is a business research company providing marketing reports to industry. The marketing reports forecast the hardware, services, customers, suppliers, technology, and economics of emerging and established industries.

Frost & Sullivan publishes 200-400-page industry forecasts of European, American, and World markets prepared by industrial consultants. Each report includes a forecast of market size by product, market share by company and by end use, and financial developments. The reports analyze segments of the data processing, telecommunications, office automation, defense, aerospace, chemicals, health, plastics, electronics, automated manufacturing, instrumentation and controls, paper, energy, food, consumer products, and financial services. The reports generally give some market size information and table of contents in the flyer sent to promote the studies.

GUIDE TO U.S. GOVERNMENT PUBLICATIONS

The current edition (1985) is comprised of two volumes, published by DOCUMENTS INDEX, McLean, Virginia.

Volume 1 covers all current agencies as of July 1, 1984, as well as those agencies abolished or changed during the period since January 1, 1980. Also included are the Agency Class Chronology, the Agency Index, and the Title Index (published on an annual basis).

Volume 2 covers agencies abolished or changed prior to January 1, 1980 (published every five years).

The basis of the classification is the grouping together of the publications of any government author (the various departments, bureaus, and agencies being considered the authors). In the grouping, the organizational structure of the U.S. Government is followed; i.e., subordinate bureaus and divisions are grouped with the parent organization.

The Superintendent of the Document Classification System was formed in the Library of the Public Documents Department at the turn of the century. Like other classification systems in use for many years, this one has expanded as the federal government has grown, and has changed in some details and methods of use, although still retaining the principals upon which it is based. The System's very complex outline is beyond the scope of this handout. The details are included in the front pages of the Guide.

HEALTHCARE FORECASTING

Healthcare Forecasting specializes in forecasting and planning studies for the pharmaceutical and medical supply industries. The company produces Pharmaceutical PROSPECTS, a multiclient forecasting service, as well as custom studies for clients.

The vast amount of data available from the physician panel doctor-patient contact reports precludes regular publication of information on all of the variables. Also, there is a multiplicity of cross relationships among these variables that may bear upon client problems. The services of IMS' analytical staff are available for consultations and to arrange for special computer tabulations not appearing in the standard reports;

10. Management Contents: Provides current information on a wide variety of business and management topics. Cover-to-cover indexing and abstracts of more than 700 business journals, newsletters, tabloids, proceedings, books, research reports, and self-study courses; and
11. Computer Data Base: Provides information on computers, telecommunications, and electronics. Designed to provide answers to questions regarding hardware, software, peripherals, and high-tech fields such as robotics, satellite communications, and videotex.

The above on-line data bases are also available on Mead Data Control's LEXIS and NEXIS reference service.

IAC makes available full text microfilm services.

BUSINESS INDEX: A unique comprehensive indexing of key journals, including Barron's, The Wall Street Journal, and the business and financial sections of The New York Times: news items, product announcements, mergers, acquisitions, and corporate promotions. To find articles at the push of a button, just press a button and find citations on the easy-to-use automated microfilm viewer.

Each month the library receives a new reel of microfilm, including citations compiled as recently as 10 days ago. Three years are cumulated on one microfilm reel.

MEDLINE (MEDLARS)

The National Library of Medicine (NLM) first began to experiment with on-line bibliographic search services in 1967. Prior to that time, NLM had been using a computerized system for the production of Index Medicus and for individualized "demand searches" of the Index Medicus data base which were processed in batches against the entire file. This computer system, called MEDLARS (Medical Literature Analysis and Retrieval System), had been expanding with the growth of biomedical literature and with the increasing number of demand searches processed. (The term MEDLARS still refers to the entire NLM system.)

Considerable upgrading has taken place to make available MEDLINE (MEDLARS ON-LINE). The first problem to be resolved in developing MEDLINE was to find a better and less expensive communications system. TYMNET and TELENET provided such a system. In 1974, all current citations from Index Medicus and a "special list" of journals were merged into one file: MEDLINE. At that time, the TOXLINE and CHEMLINE data bases were added to the NLM system.

TOXLINE (TOXicology Information On-LINE) contains citations dealing with toxicology, adverse effects of drugs and chemicals, environmental pollution, and industrial health and safety. CHEMLINE is an on-line chemical dictionary for the chemical substances uniquely identified by Chemical Abstracts Service (CAS).

Other data bases are available through the NLM on-line network: CLINPROT (Clinical Cancer Protocols) and RTECS (Registry of Toxic Effects of Chemical Substances); HISTLINE (History of Medicine On-Line), BIOETHICS (the Health Planning & Administration file), and POPLINE (Population Information On-Line).

MEDLINE can be accessed directly with, of course, the proper authorization and also through the DIALOG system (see page 7).

PROMT (Predicasts' Overview of Markets and Technology) is a most complete on-line data base covering company and product information.

7. MARKETING AND ADVERTISING REFERENCE SERVICE

Marketing and Advertising Reference Service (MARS) offers access to information on advertising and marketing of consumer products and services. MARS provides information on new products and marketing strategies, advertising techniques, and consumer research; and

8. NEW PRODUCT ANNOUNCEMENTS

New Product Announcements (NPA) offers access to the full text announcements of new products and technologies. News releases typically contain the latest new product information and usually include product descriptions, specifications, availability and distribution, applications, market data, and contacts.

Predicasts receives news releases from a broad range of industries and companies. Updates are added weekly.

CATALOG OF PUBLICATIONS OF THE NATIONAL CENTER FOR HEALTH STATISTICS
