

### Entry into the regional phase under Chapter II before the EPO as elected Office (within 31 months from the priority date)\*

PCT pamphlet (published international application) containing:

- copy of international application (description, claims, abstract, drawings) as originally filed
- copy of international search report and English translation (if not already in English)

WIPO

- copy of any amendments to the claims (and any statement) under Article 19


Copy of priority document



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# Accelerated examination of European patent applications "PACE"

 Available for all Euro-PCT applications, irrespective of whether the EPO acted as ISA or IPEA, regardless of the subject matter of the application

- 2. The request for accelerated examination
  - may be filed upon entry into the European regional phase or later
    - must be made in writing

need not contain any specific reasons

is free of charge

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3. Applicants may file a substantive response (reasoned observations or amendments or both) to the IPER upon entering the regional phase without awaiting the first examination report from the EPO

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



A written request for examination must be made and the examination fee must be paid within six months after the publication by the International Bureau of the international search report or within the time limit applicable under PCT Article 22 or 39(1) (21 months or 31 months from the prority date), whichever expires later.

## **European designations**


- 1. In the PCT application, the designation "EP" covers all the EPC member States which are also PCT Contracting States on the international filing date
- 2. If a Chapter II demand is filed and "all eligible States" are elected, all EPC member States which were designated are elected (except ES and GR which are not bound by Chapter II)\*
- 3. The 31-month time limit for entry into the EP regional phase will then apply to all EPC States originally designated -- as long as at least one eligible EPC State was elected -- because of the unitary character of the European application
- 4. It is only at the time of entry into the EP regional phase that the selection of some, or all, of the EPC States for which the applicant wishes to proceed must be made and the European designation fees for those States paid to the EPO
