## Dear Norm:

Enclosed you will find a copy of a letter which we received from Senator Nelson in response to our letter soliciting his support for S. 414. I would appreciate having your comments on his remarks in paragraph 2 of his letter and also your comments on the question that he raised in paragraph 3.

In regard to the background rights, I chatted with Joe Allen who indicated that that issue was a concern and that it may be that some restriction on the Government taking any background rights could be inserted into the Bill in a noncontroversial manner.

Dr. DeLuca is planning to testify on April 11 and I have suggested to him that he recommend some change which will result in the protection of research protocols, hypotheses or designs from disclosure prior to funding. I suggested that he utilize the National Commission for the Protection of Human Subjects of Biomedical and Behavioral Research and the President's Biomedical Research Panel reports, neither of which I find I have in my files, as support for such suggestion. There is little doubt that the conclusions of both of these groups included the recommendation for non-disclosure prior to funding.

Will you please let me have your comments sometime next week if possible. I will be out of town all week but would like to send Senator Nelson a reply the following week preparatory to the testimony which will be given on S. 414 after the April 11 hearings.
