Rimmer de Vries, in an article in the February 20, 1978 edition of <u>Business Week</u>, points out the fundamental problem with the depreciating dollar - the need for a national export policy. In addition to improving export financing, de Vries states "We have to develop new technology and go out and sell the stuff."

The Carter Administration must grasp what to many has long been obvious. A government grant and contract patent title policy will stifle the development of new technology. Accordingly, support of the Thornton Bill is a necessary step to solve the U.S. balance-of-payments problem and to promote the welfare of its citizens.
