Dear Mr. Rosten:

You have inquired as to whether a specific policy has been established by the Regents of the University of Wisconsin as to the ownership of inventions by members of the University staff. No such general policy has ever been established by the Regents. Therefore, basically, the ownership of inventions by members of the University of Wisconsin staff is vested in the inventors.

There are some exceptions to this general rule, particularly with reference to patent rights and patent licenses in connection with inventions developed under certain research contracts supported by outside agencies, particularly agencies of the federal government. In such cases where, under the terms of such research contracts, the University has agreed to grant certain rights to the contracting agencies, the University requires each of the University staff members working on such projects to sign affidavits agreeing to do whatever is necessary to permit the University to fulfill its commitments to grant patent rights or patent licensing agreements under such research contracts.
