Dear Howard:

I found your good letter of February 21 extremely enlightening and helpful. As an immediate follow-up to it, I spoke with Joe Allen in the Department of Commerce who told me that the Fuqua Bill would probably be introduced the first week of April. Subsequently, I talked with Jim Turner, Counsel to the Science Research and Technology Sub-Committee and to Dr. Harold Hanson. I spoke to them in very favorable terms about the Fuqua equivalent of S.2171 but indicated a negative view of any recoupment provision. Joe Allen assured me earlier that the recoupment provision had been deleted from the Fuqua version.

Mr. Turner and Dr. Hanson both promised that they would keep this office informed as to the progress of the bill. Hearings will probably not be convened for another month. When I hear anything, I will be happy to keep your office informed, and of course I would be glad to do anything I could, should you need me to do so.

I am sorry that I will not see you at the Trustee's meeting in June. Unfortunately, I will be in England on vacation at that time and will be unable to attend. Thus, I will look forward to seeing you next February but will hope to hear from you before that.
