The disclosure forwarded to your offices previously, entitled "Dental Appliance for Support of Intraoral Air Pressure Sensors" by Edward Kent Fritch was prepared by Professor John H. Saxon, since we are not able to obtain the disclosure from Mr. Fritch. Professor Saxon spent considerable effort in preparing the disclosure and I am hopeful that you will accept it in lieu of the answers to your twelve questions which you forwarded.

Professor Karl U. Smith is developing answers to the twelve questions for his invention entitled "Scleral Lens Light". This report should be forwarded to you in the near future.

Concerning the letter to Dr. John B. Wolff from Professor Hyuk Yu, it is my understanding that this invention is not as yet sufficiently defined to permit the preparation of a formal invention report. If the invention is defined sometime in the future, we will forward the necessary report.

I know of no information to provide you concerning Dr. Bernard Z. Friedlander's invention entitled "Time-Sampling Tape Recorder System". It was Dr. Friedlander's decision to release the entire right to the U. S. Government as indicated in my letter of February 9.

Mr. Howard Bremer has furnished me a copy of your letter to him Mated October 23, concerning the Stuart J. Updike and Theodore L. Goodfriend invention entitled "Reagent for Imminological Determinations". by I trust that Mr. Bremer will provide any additional information which you need.
