Dear Howard:

Further to a decision made at our last meeting, in Chicago, I am pleased to report that circular letters have been sent out to all major Canadian universities introducing them to the existence of SUPA and some of the benefits which it may provide.

Attached hereto you will find two circular letters, one in English and the other in French, which were sent to some 50 Canadian universities.

As you may be aware, the Canadian government is looking in to the possibility of modifying both the Patent and the Copyright Laws that reflect the evolving technologies in the areas of innovation and creative works. This is of crucial importance to all Canadian universities and if it were possible to arrange to have a speaker on this subject at our next meeting, I believe that it would have a very strong impact upon Canadian participation.
