Dear Senator Nelson:

The Licensing Executives Society (USA) is composed of over 1,200 businessmen who have significant responsibility for technology transfer and investment.

We understand that the Subcommittee on Monopoly held hearings on December 19 to 21, 1977, directed to an overview on government patent policy. Upon inquiry, we were informed that the Licensing Executives Society ("LES") could not make a statement at these hearings, although LES could make a statement at further hearings contemplated in the future.

We are most disappointed to learn that LES could not make a statement at these particular hearings which, in being directed to an overview, are most important in that the record of them will have a considerable impact on, and weigh heavily on, subsequent statements.

It is, of course, understandable that you should have some ideas on the topic before the "overview" hearings, for you have been interested in this subject over the years.

On the other hand, there is a very responsible view of many persons experienced in the subject matter who have no personal ax to grind (as well as a view of

So far as we have been able to determine from the list of witnesses for the "overview" hearings, the hearings received the statements of a select group of people who for the most part share your preconceived view. They were not cross-examined by persons having experience in the area who hold a different view, out of which the basis for error in their view might be developed. Their testimony was not balanced by views of professional groups having a scope of experience of knowledge different from the few persons selected to testify at the hearings. Ironically, evidence, including documented studies, indicates the policy you propose will achieve results opposite from those you intend. LES in principle supports the concepts embodied in H.R. 8596, "Uniform Federal Research and Development Utilization Act of 1977" which does support these results.

The Licensing Executives Society accordingly, does wish to have this letter included in the record of the "overview" hearings, and requests an opportunity to present its view to the Subcommittee, either in open hearings or in private session with the Subcommittee and staff if that is preferred.
