
Title: "Rules of Game"

The title appearing on the copies is "Rules for Game" while that given in the application is "Rules of Game." The examiner takes the position that a better identifying title should appear on the application. Mrs. Brady supports the contention of the examiner.

In the opinion of Mr. Wise and Mr. Smith registration should be made as applied for. The title given in the application agrees substantially with the title given on the copy. Furthermore, the work may be indexed on the records of the Office to show clearly that the rules refer to "Factory and Supply Conscription and Concentration Camp."

Remitter: Babson's Reports, Inc. (Trust)--Class A.


Title: "Truths from Babson's Reports on Investment for Protection and Profit" and 13 others.

Question: Division of opinion as to whether registration may be made for each loose-leaf sheet of the work as applied for.

Applicant has filed fourteen applications for the fourteen pages of "Truths From Babson's Reports on Investment for Protection and Profit." Each page bears its own copyright notice and its own title.

In the opinion of Mr. Wise and Mr. Smith there seems no reason for the Office to question these applications. If applicant desires to guard against danger incident to separation of pages the Office can cooperate by accepting the applications for each page under its own title. Mrs. Brady, on the other hand, takes the position that only one registration is necessary if the pages are distributed together as a unit. Here memorandum is attached hereto.
