
Title: "Camellias Floral Gems from China, Price List No. 79."

Question: Classification.

The copy filed is a single page folder containing a price list of "Camellias, floral gems from China." The first page which hits the eye bears some pictorial matter in the way of an artistic tree showing only the trunk and first branch.

The Revisory Board is of the opinion that classification of a work of this type as a commercial print was not the contemplation of Members of Congress. It is their belief that registration should be made for a price list of this character under the category of book. However, there is pictorial matter in the nature of a print or pictorial illustration and it is employed in the sale and advertising of articles of merchandise, Camellias, and following previous decisions the Board feels bound to recommend classification KK for this material. A conference on this subject with the Assistant Register in the very near future is requested in order that the Revisory Board may be in closer touch and harmony with the established practices.


Title: "The Individual and the World, Vols. 1-3"

The notice of copyright in this case does not appear upon the title-page or page immediately following. The title-page is followed by two pages listing the contributing educators with a short biographical sketch of each. Following this is a page bearing the table of contents, on the back of which is printed the copyright notice.

The Revisory Board if following strictly the provisions of Section 19 of the Copyright Act is bound to reject this application for the notice is not on the title-page or the page immediately following. However, the notice is in a very prominent position which would not be overlooked by any member of the public examining the copy. Material of a similar character has been passed for registration, and the Revisory Board is of the opinion that an exception should be made in this case with a warning letter to the copyright proprietor.
