Dear Jon Cavicchi:

This is a final response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request received by the U.S. Copyright Office on August 12, 2021. *See* email from Jon Cavicchi to U.S. Copyright Office (Aug. 12, 2021). Your initial request was for Revisory Board opinions from 1937 – 1947.

After a thorough search of our files the Office located 2,024 pages of responsive records from 1937 – 1945. The Office’s search did not produce records between 1946 – 1947. The 2,024 pages of records are being released to you in their entirety. The records are divided into five .pdf files, which will be delivered in a separate email where you will be able to download the files from Media Shuttle, a large file sharing program authorized for use by the Library of Congress. This disclosure constitutes a final production.

Right to appeal. Should you believe that this response constitutes an improper denial of a valid FOIA request, you may file a written appeal postmarked within ninety days of the date of this letter. Your appeal should clearly identify the agency determination that is being appealed, include the assigned docket number, 42-2021, and include a statement explaining the basis for the appeal. Write “Freedom of Information Act Appeal” on the letter and envelope in a prominently visible manner and send it to: Register of Copyrights, U.S. Copyright Office, P.O. Box 70400, Washington, D.C. 20024.
