ORDER RE: PLAINTIFFS' MOTION FOR PERMANENT INJUNCTIVE RELIEF

Presently pending before this Court is Plaintiffs' Motion for Permanent injunctive
Relief (DE # 159, filed 11/27/02). Prior to the commencement of the jury trial in this case, the
undersigned ruled that the motion would not be considered as a pretrial motion, but that the
merits of the request for injunctive relief would be considered as part of the demand made in
the Complaint, in connection with the evidence presented at the jury trial and any additional
evidence presented to the Court at a bench trial on injunctive relief thereafter. A post-trial
status and scheduling conference was held on April 10, 2003, for the purpose of scheduling
the remaining matters to be considered by the Court. At that time, in accordance with their
Joint Proposed Agenda (DE # 286), the parties proposed that resolution of pending motions
for judgment as a matter of law and for a new trial prior to disposition of the request for
injunctive relief. Counsel for Defendants suggested that the request for injunctive relief
might become moot after disposition of those motions. Therefore, the Court has deferred
consideration of the request for injunctive relief. Based upon the above proceedings, it is
hereby

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that Plaintiffs' Motion for Permanent Injunctive Relief (DE #159) is DENIED to the extent that it requested pretrial relief, and is held in abeyance pending determination of the motions for judgment as a matter of law and for a new trial. A status and scheduling conference will be entered after disposition of those motions with

respect to determination of the request for injunctive relief. The Clerk of the Court is directed to remove this motion from the pending motions list.
