and Reexamination of Patents...... 301". Sec. 102. Subsection (b) of section 6 of Public Law 96-517 (94 Stat. 3027) and the amendment made by it are repealed.

SEC. 103. The first sentence of section 31(a) of the Trademark Act of 1946 (15 U.S.C. 1113(a)) is amended by striking out "of Patents".

TITLE II—CHANGES IN THE CIVIL RIGHTS OF INSTITUTIONALIZED PERSONS ACT

Sec. 201. (a) That portion of section 4(a) of the Civil Rights on Institutionalized Persons Act which precedes paragraph (1) thereof is amended by striking out "section 2" and inserting in lieu thereof "section 3".

(b) That portion of section 8 of the Civil Rights of Institutionalized Persons Act which precedes paragraph (1) thereof is amended by striking out "Attorney" and inserting in lieu thereof "Attorney General".

Mr. Speaker, H.R. 3345 makes technical and conforming changes in title United States Code, Patents, Public Law 96-517, the Trademark Act of 1946, and the Civil Rights of Institutionalized Persons Act.

The bill was prepared by the House Judiciary Committee to correct certain technical errors in those laws. The bill does not make any substantive change in the law.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## TITLE I-CHANGES IN THE PATENT AND TRADEMARK LAWS

SEC. 101. Title 35 of the United States Code is amended-

(1) in the first sentence of section 41(a) by striking out "of Patents":

(2)(A) in the first sentence of section 41(b) by striking out "the first day of the first fiscal year beginning on or after one calendar year after enactment of this Act" and inserting in lieu thereof "October 1, 1982"

(B) in the second sentence of section 41(b) by striking out "the first day of the first fiscal year beginning on or after one calenmakes no substantive change in existing law.

I urge my colleagues to support H.R. 3345.
