Mr. DORN introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

Granting an extension of patent to the United Daughters of the Confederacy.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That (a) a certain design patent issued by the United
4 States Patent Office of date November 8, 1898, being patent
5 numbered 29,611, which is the insignia of the United
6 Daughters of the Confederacy, which was renewed and
7 extended for a period of fourteen years by Public Law
8 Numbered 220, Seventy-seventh Congress, approved August
9 18, 1941, is hereby renewed and extended for an additional
10 period of fourteen years from and after the date of enact-
11 ment of this Act, with all the rights and privileges pertain-

1 ing to the same, being generally known as the insignia of the
2 United Daughters of the Confederacy.

3 (b) No person who has manufactured the design of such
4 patent between August 18, 1955, and the date of the
5 enactment of this Act shall be held liable for infringement
6 of such patent by reason of the continued manufacture and
7 sale thereof.
