AN ACT

Granting an extension of patent to the United Daughters of the Confederacy.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,* That a certain design patent issued by the United States Patent Office of date November 8, 1898, being patent numbered 29,611, which was renewed and extended for a period of fourteen years by Public Law Numbered 242, Sixty-ninth Congress, approved May 18, 1926, is hereby renewed and extended for an additional period of fourteen years from and after the passage of this Act, with all the rights and privileges pertaining to the same, being generally known as the insignia of the United Daughters of the Confederacy: *Provided, however,* That no person who has manufactured the design of said patent between the 18th day of May 1940 and the date of the passage of this Act shall be held liable for infringement of this patent by reason of the continued manufacture and sale thereof.
